We are Over 2 months away from the 82nd annual Pennsylvania State Skeet Open Championship and PSSA is working hard to make this another great shooting event. well as squadding all of you. She is no stranger to running registered shoots as she has been the shoot manager at Generations Skeet Club since its inception. Our Chief Referee will be Bob Wilkin Jr. I'm sure you all know him as "Little Bob" and he casts a shadow as big as his father does. He is busy right now putting his team together to serve you all with top notch and professional referees. Tami Daniels-Means and her husband Al will be in the registration building again this year. They do a super job and are real professionals doing what they do best-getting you registered and then out on the shoot-off fields!

The 2018 Event program has been uploaded to the home page and the reservation form is there as well. Please let Tori Holtz know if you will download all the registration material from the website and don't require her to mail you a form and program flyer. This will save PSSA much needed funds. As we frequently use email "blasts" through the website, I would encourage you all to add your email to the list, if you have not already.

Congratulations to the 2018 State Teams! The list can be found on our website.

With the recent decrease in attendance, we will be operating on 11 competition fields instead of the regular 12 and we'll have 2 practice fields for a total of 13, all with Lincoln traps. This makes it imperative that you send your reservation forms in as soon as possible (**but not postmarked before July 1**st) to get your preferred rotation. Rotation A & B are always the most popular and always fill up fast. Registration forms will be sorted by postmark date and squads filled accordingly. If registration shows a trend of over 160 shooters, we will open an additional field.

Something new this year!! Added money!! Yep, that's right. Thanks to R. Dennis Lehman who

spearheaded to the committee to raise funds for added money, \$4000.00 has been raised through generous donations from around the skeet world. Thank you's and honors will be given at the State Shoot with details. Another new feature this year, we will be giving away one 4 gun entry fee package for an adult shooter who has never shot the State Shoot before. Drawn from a hat of all new adult shooters registering 4 guns in their first State Shoot. Get the word out!!

PSSA will be handling ammo sales and collecting money for practice rounds from the Registration building. The shoot management asks that you pay for practice rounds before going out to the field. Any shooting of "a few" targets with your coach to fix a problem target between flights and not on the practice fields is strictly forbidden! The traps all have counters on them and we pay for every target thrown. This has been a big problem in the past and upwards of \$900.00 of unpaid targets were thrown last year. We operate on a tight budget and try to hold down the entry fees to the lowest we can and still break even. Also, please limit the "look" targets to one high, one low and one pair at the start of your rotation. Any look targets saved in subsequent rounds helps our bottom line by keeping unnecessary targets thrown to a minimum. Under NO circumstances shall any shooter and unauthorized persons go inside the trap houses. We have staff mechanics and trap loaders to handle any maintenance requests. As part of our ongoing safety measures, we ask that spectators, families and friends wear protective eyewear and hearing protection while watching shooters. There are many folks watching from lawn chairs who are just as vulnerable to be hit by a ricochet BB as the shooters. We will be enforcing this safety measure vigorously. Come prepared with the proper safety equipment or you will be asked to move.
